#### **Background**

The Economy Committee scrutinises the work of the Mayor and investigates matters relating to economic development, wealth creation, social development, culture, sport and tourism in London. The Committee is currently exploring the internship situation in London and are seeking to understand more about:

- a) Scale: The numbers of young Londoners doing internships
- b) Quality: The quality of the internships, peoples motivations, experiences and the outcomes i.e. are they paid/unpaid, why they chose internships over other things, the skills they have developed, if they have led on to employment etc.

#### The Research

Though Talk London we carried out an online survey targeting young adults aged 19-30 in London who are currently doing or have completed an internship. The aim of this survey is to gather information about the nature of the internships that are taking place in the city.

#### Results

- This report summarises the results from the Talk London internship survey.
- Interviewing was conducted through an online self-completion survey from 29th July to 31st Oct 2014 and 120 responses were received.
- Percentages are based on the number of respondents who answered each question (see base number).
- Where results do not sum to 100%, this may be due to multiple responses, computer rounding or the exclusion of don't knows/not stated.
- Please note that due to the sample size the data presented in these slides is indicative only and should be treated with caution.

#### **Definition of internships for the survey**

For the purposes of this survey an internship is one kind of employment taken up by an individual after they have completed their studies (school, college or university), but before they start their career. It lasts between one month and one year, and involves an agreement to work set hours and complete specific pieces of work that would otherwise be carried out by someone else. It does not include work experience, volunteering or apprenticeships, or internships that form part of a degree course or are done at the same time as studying. This definition was explained to respondents at the start of the survey.

#### **Key findings**

- Young people are applying for and doing more than one internship. 56% of respondents have applied for 1 to 5 internships and 31% have applied for 6 to 20. Over half (55%) have undertaken just one internship in London but 23% have done two and another 23% have done three or more internships. The average length of time respondents have worked as an intern is 7 months.
- The most popular sectors for undertaking internships are the charity or public sector (37%) and politics (21%).
- The majority of respondents (68%) were aged between 21 and 25 years when they started their internship.
- 57% of the internships lasted 3 months or less, 27% lasted 4 to 6 months, and 5% were a year or longer. The average internship length is 4.6 months. Two thirds (66%) of respondents were doing their internships as full time roles working 31 to 48 hours.
- The most popular way to find out about internships is through online searching for internship vacancies with 35% doing this. 27% saw an advert by the company and 20% found out about their internship through a personal contact.
- The main reasons for doing internships are to improve CV/job prospects by gaining experience (85%) and developing new skills (60%). Trying out work in the sector is also an important reason (45%). Just 16% said that earning money was a key reason for doing an internship.
- Satisfaction with the internships undertaken is high. The vast majority (80%) are satisfied with the contribution their role of intern made to the organisation and around three quarters are satisfied with the opportunities to develop relevant skills (77%) and the amount the organisation valued their role (74%)
- Just 32% of respondents were satisfied with the amount they were paid for their internship. 54% think interns should be paid the London Living wage but only 14% were actually paid this. 41% were paid just lunch and travel expenses and a further 16% were paid nothing at all.
- 39% said they didn't need to supplement the money they earned during the internship while 47% supplemented their earnings with personal savings and the same amount supplemented their earnings through money and support from families.
- Of those currently doing an internship 45% think it is likely to lead to a job in the same organisation and 80% think it will lead to a job in a different organisation. However in practice we see that for those who have completed their internship it has led to a job in the same organisation for just 28% and led to work in a different organisation for 38%.
- The vast majority agree that internships are a good way to develop skills for work (87%) and 85% think that doing the internship has improved their chances of getting a job. 65% would recommend doing an internship to a friend and 43% would consider doing another internship in the future.
- 55% of respondents had a degree and 27% a higher degree. The lowest level of qualification was 2 or more A levels/ 4 or more AS levels (13%).
