SUBJECT: Resolution Approving Amended Mission Statement and Performance Report

Reason before the Members

Public Authorities Law Sections 2824-a and 2800(1)(a)(3) require every state authority to have a brief mission statement expressing the purpose and goals of the authority, a description of the stakeholders of the authority and their reasonable expectations from the authority, and a list of measurements by which performance of the authority and the achievement of its goals may be evaluated. Additionally, Public Authorities Law Section 2824-a requires every state authority to reexamine its mission statement and performance on an annual basis. The purpose of this resolution is to review HTFC's mission statement and to publish the results of HTFC's performance.

A report on HTFC's performance based on the criteria identified and last readopted in June 2017 is attached for the Member's review and approval.

Staff has proposed an amendment to the mission statement to add language acknowledging HTFC's commitment to the advancement of MWBE and fair housing goals. Moving forward, its commitment will also be added as a measure of HTFC's performance. A proposed amended mission statement is attached with the additional language redlined for the Member's review and approval.

Mission Statement	HTFC's mission is to further community development through the construction, development, revitalization and preservation of low-income housing, the development and preservation of businesses, the creation of job opportunities, and the development of public infrastructures and facilities. In accordance with the initiatives of the Governor, HTFC's mission is expanded to further recovery, rebuilding, and resiliency efforts of homes, businesses, and public

Means to Achieve Mission	HTFC accomplishes its mission by providing loans and grants to local housing partnerships that are committed to the development of low-income housing and coordinating local housing partnerships with existing state, federal and local programs, and by providing loans and grants to municipalities committed to economic development and the preservation and development of public infrastructures and facilities.
	HTFC further accomplishes its mission by providing grants, loans, and credit enhancements to eligible homeowners, small business owners, units of local government, and qualified not-for-profit organizations in storm-affected counties throughout New York State.
	In fulfilling its mission, HTFC commits to advance MWBE goals and fair housing goals.
Stakeholder Description	HTFC's stakeholders are homeowners, renters, municipalities and members of municipalities, the business community, the financial community, housing developers, builders, not-for-profit organizations, and community leaders.
Reasonable Expectations of Stakeholders	The stakeholders can reasonably expect that HTFC will consider their needs and concerns, that HTFC awards and funds will be fairly and rationally awarded in compliance with the goals of HTFC as set forth by the Legislature, that actions taken will be transparent, and that HTFC will strive to facilitate coordination among federal, state, and local governments to achieve the maximum success in meeting the goals of HTFC.

List of Performance Goals:

WHEREAS, the Housing Trust Fund Corporation ("HTFC") was created pursuant to Section 45-a of the New York Private Housing Finance Law; and

WHEREAS, the Public Authorities Law requires every public authority to have a mission statement expressing the purpose and goals of the authority, to set forth a list of measurements by which performance and the achievement of the authority's goals may be evaluated, to examine its performance on an annual basis, and to reexamine its mission statement on an annual basis; and

WHEREAS, on June 27, 2017, in accordance with the Public Authorities Law, HTFC reviewed and readopted its mission statement and measurements by which performance and the achievement of HTFC's goals may be evaluated; and

WHEREAS, HTFC staff has compiled information based on the measurement criteria including the number and type of awards made, the areas of the State served, the number of businesses or jobs created or retained, the timeliness of decision making, the amount of leveraging of awards, and HTFC's compliance with all applicable laws the information has been set forth in the report titled "Report on Performance Based on Mission Statement Measurement Criteria"; and

WHEREAS, the Members have reviewed HTFC's performance as set forth in the Report on Performance Based on Mission Statement Measurement Criteria and find HTFC's performance to be in accordance with HTFC's mission; and

WHEREAS, staff has proposed an amendment to the mission statement to acknowledge HTFC's commitment to the advancement of MWBE and fair housing goals; this commitment will be added as a measure of HTFC's performance; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, by the Members of the HTFC as follows:

Section 1. The Members hereby approve the Report on Performance Based on Mission Statement Measurement Criteria.

Section 2. The Members hereby approve the amended mission statement.

Section 3. The Members hereby authorize the amended mission statement and the Report on Performance Based on Mission Statement Measurement Criteria to be published in accordance with the Public Authorities Law and any other reporting requirements.
